Reflection.

Even at this early stage in our Lord’s life there is trouble for him. The Wise Men have come from afar and arrived in Jerusalem. It is reasonable to think that a king may be born where a king lives. The Wise Men bring out the worst of Herod but don’t see it. Herod is told what it says in scripture and he should have been reassured by it. But no. All he sees is a rival and the only way to deal with rivals is to see them off.

The Wise Men follow the star to where the Child is and they offer their gifts. Then go back by a different route.
